Dear Colleagues, and everyone with an interest in this subject,

The time has come and we are meeting at the Goetheanum once again! This year we will concern ourselves with the prevention and treatment of burnout, as well as with how it arises in the first place. The syndrome has a long history — as long ago as in Homer's *Odyssey* we find a passage in Book 10 in which the goddess Circe says to Odysseus:

[...] 'now you are weakened and dispirited, always thinking of your arduous wanderings, and never does joy give you strength and encouragement: you have suffered much.' Thus she spoke, and our proud hearts assented. So we stayed for a whole year, from one day to the next [...]

(lines 463-467 in transmission of J.H.Voss)

Odysseus and his men are so exhausted and dispirited that it takes a year before they think about continuing with their journey! One year — that is the recovery period for classic burnout.

On a number of occasions patients came to my practice who wanted to return to work after one or two weeks and I had to tell them that it would probably take a year before they were well again. When a year later they were able to start their reintegration into work, they recalled how stunned they had been about this at the time. Fortunately physicians have meanwhile become a lot more sensitive to this issue and patients often come at an earlier stage so that therapy can mostly take place in parallel to work.

The biographies of many people are an odyssey today. Many of our fellow human beings have to suffer a great deal before they find a productive path with regard to themselves and their work. In our restless time the individual actively has to create their own rhythm and recuperation otherwise there is a great drain on our vital forces which at some point leads to exhaustion and a feeling of a lack of perspective and meaning. The life forces grow weaker and weaker and people feel burnt out. Such exhaustion is often amplified by a lack of acknowledgement from our social environment.

In education, the teacher or therapist can often take preventive measures. We can teach children already to find and stay within their own limits. So that "digital exhaustion", for example, does not determine our everyday lives.

1. The euphony of the voice through sun, moon and hands

We will learn the basic principles of Terlusollogy®, which distinguishes between different breathing types according to solar and lunar. Then with the help of articulation ex-ercises, and with specific finger and hand movements, we will see how we can more easily find the euphony of our own voice.

2. Exercises to experience the action of the invisible human being in us

On the basis of the preceding explanation based on the anthroposophical understanding of the human being, we will bring the body to experience as an internal space through inner sensing exercises. In this way we can draw in art – here in speech – on the etheric sphere permeated by the I, and thus on the cosmic world of sound.

3. Recreating language: sound – word – speech improvisation

Listening, hearing in a new way, playing with the creative forces in language — speech improvisation as a way to open up poetry both for the speaker and listener. We will practice and work on poems to overcome death, of new creation, e.g. Paul Celan: "Einmal, da hörte ich ihn", Nelly Sachs: "Wenn der Tag leer wird" and from the Epistles of Paul. Speech improvisation is also a path, motivating pupils and classes withdrawn and "grown silent" to speak again.

4. Treatment of burnout syndrome through therapeutic creative speech

We will set out the various phases of burnout and, using case studies among other things, work with you on various exercises which have proven themselves in its treatment. The background to burnout in the context of the anthroposophical understanding of the human being and other aspects of the syndrome will be discussed.
